TONY SELBY (GLITZ)

“Having a drink at a mutual friend’s birthday party, I am introduced to John Nathan-Turner, talking about his favourite subject – food and drink. Taken six weeks to lose one stone. ‘Do you put on weight easily?’ asks JNT. ‘Can you put that stone back on?’ Three days later, the stone was back on – I got the job, Sabalom Glitz in ‘Doctor Who’. Wonderful character to play, and ‘Doctor Who’ is now, and has been for a long time, as much part of British tradition as roast beef and Royalty. Smashing cast headed by Colin Baker, the wonderful Joan Sims, who was an old mate – and so many positive and excellent contributions from Make-up, Wardrobe, Technicians, etc. There is an old saying among actors, ‘Never work with Children or Animals’. It should now be (as far as I am concerned) ‘Children, Animals and Robots’ They try to steal scenes in ‘Doctor Who’, so you have to be on your toes. I’ve been asked to come back as Glitz for another couple of episodes. Can’t be bad, can it?”
